To be completed by the End of Life Care (EoLC) education lead in the organisation or by someone who can comment upon the EoLC and communication skills education provision in the organisation in some detail; this may someone who delivers formal or informal education and training for end of life care and education/training may be their main role or part of a clinical or management role. EolC may be the main focus of the education provided or may be an element within it.

This questionnaire is mainly a mapping tool that will contribute to the TNA process by providing current information on EoLC and communication skills education and training provision. It will comment upon the nature and level of the education available and on who is providing it.

This tool can be distributed externally and can be targeted at education organisations and providers or at specific departments/faculties or individual workers within those organisations.

What is End of Life Care?

End of Life Care (EoLC) incorporates all elements of care and interactions in the daily lives of those people nearing the end of their lives - whether from disease progression or old age. A wide group of both health and social care workers are involved in this provision.

The care and support provided does not necessarily include medical or nursing care but will include the holistic assessment, care planning and management of all symptoms including pain, and provision of psychological, social, spiritual and practical support.
