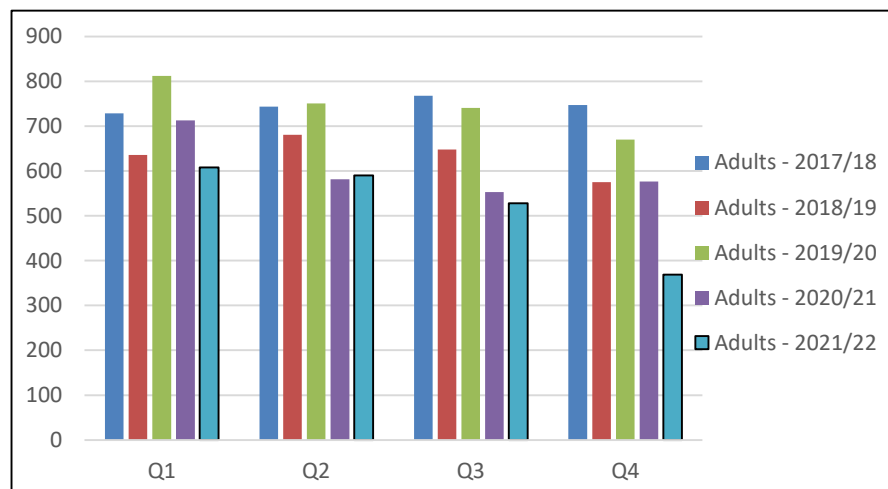
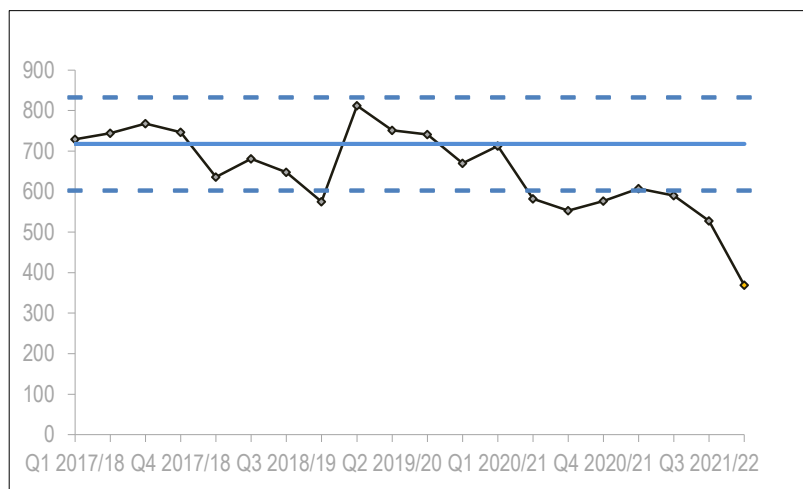
Bed Occupancy Quarter 4



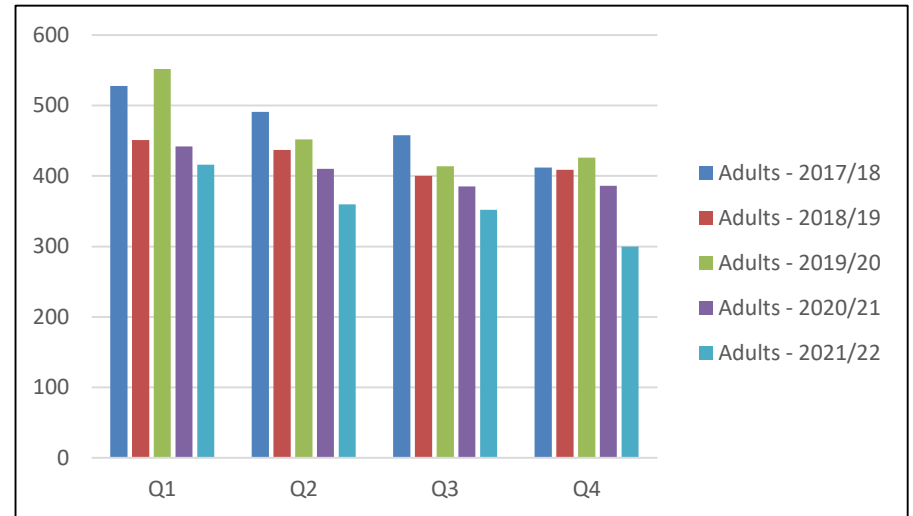
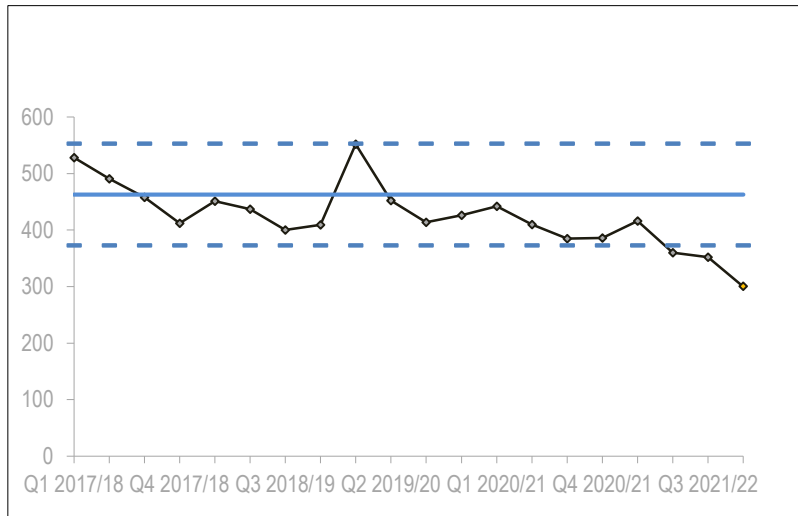
Deaths and discharges Quarter 4



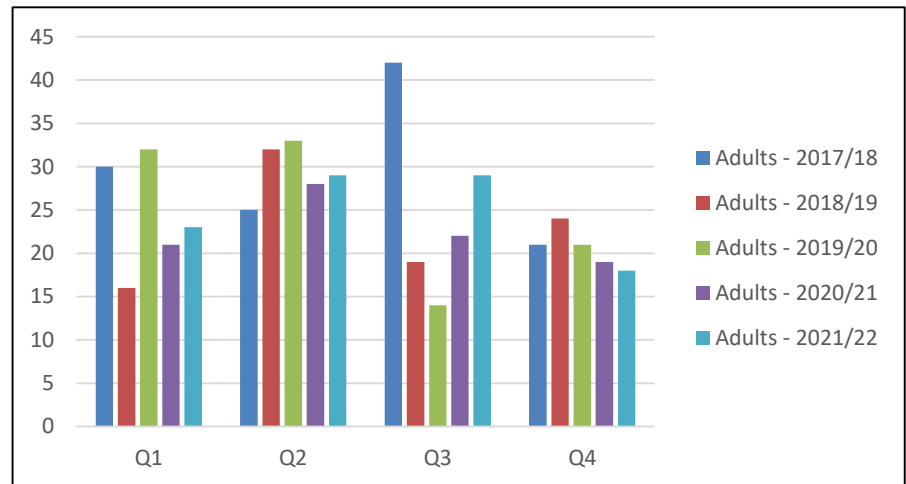
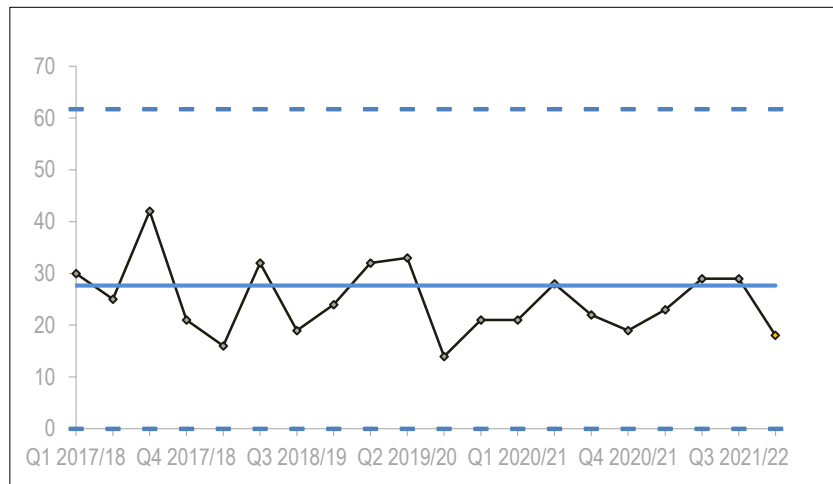
Sum of Level 1 falls over time



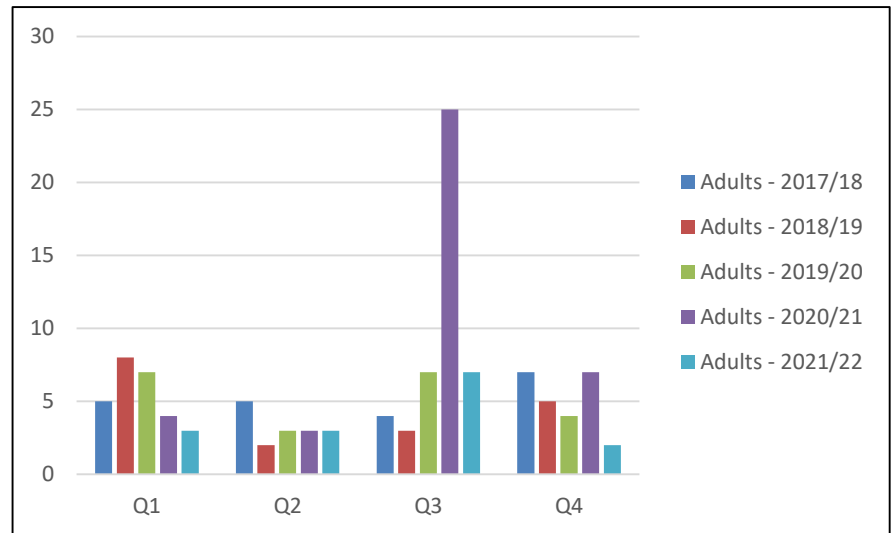
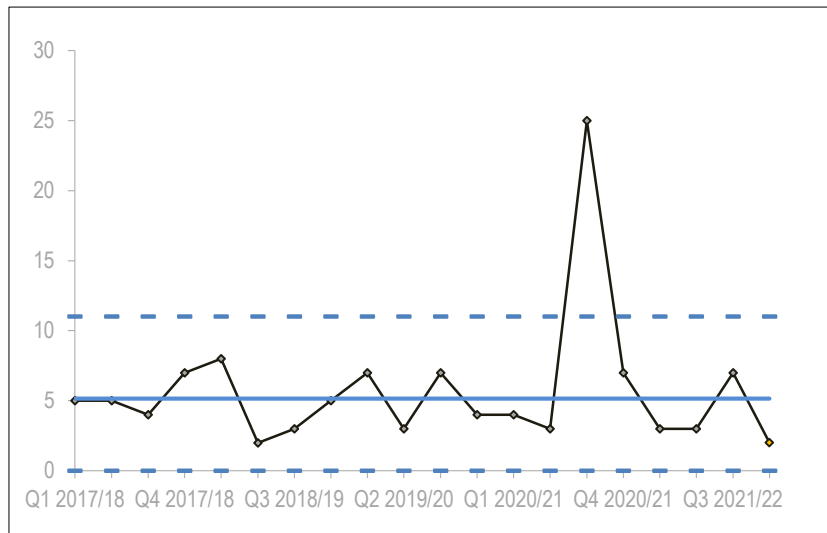
Sum of Level 2 falls over time



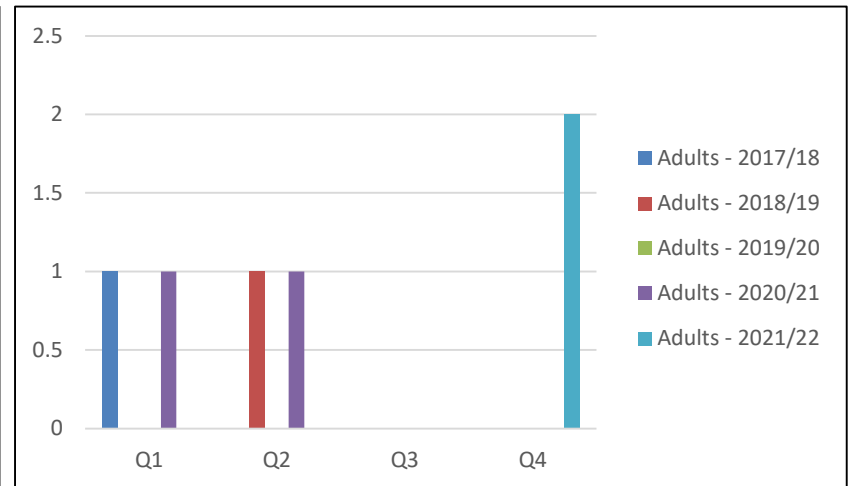
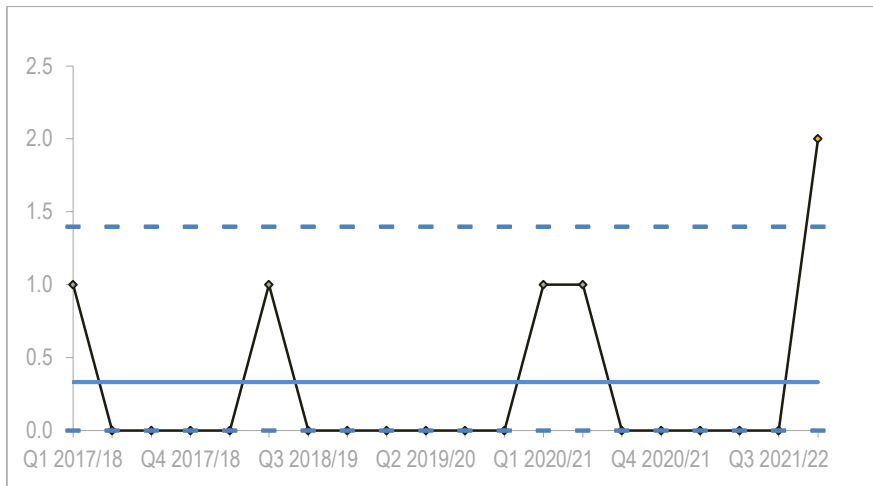
Sum of Level 3 falls over time



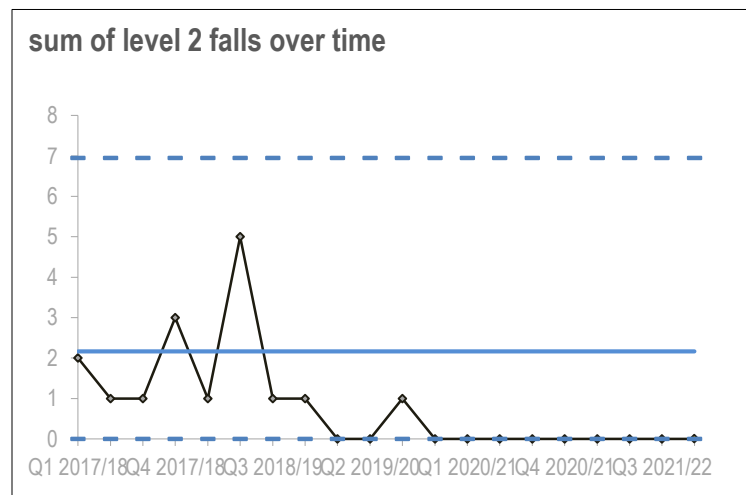
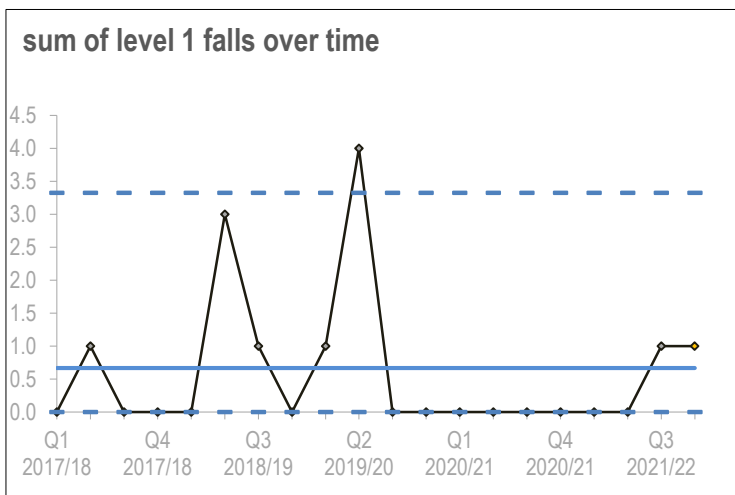
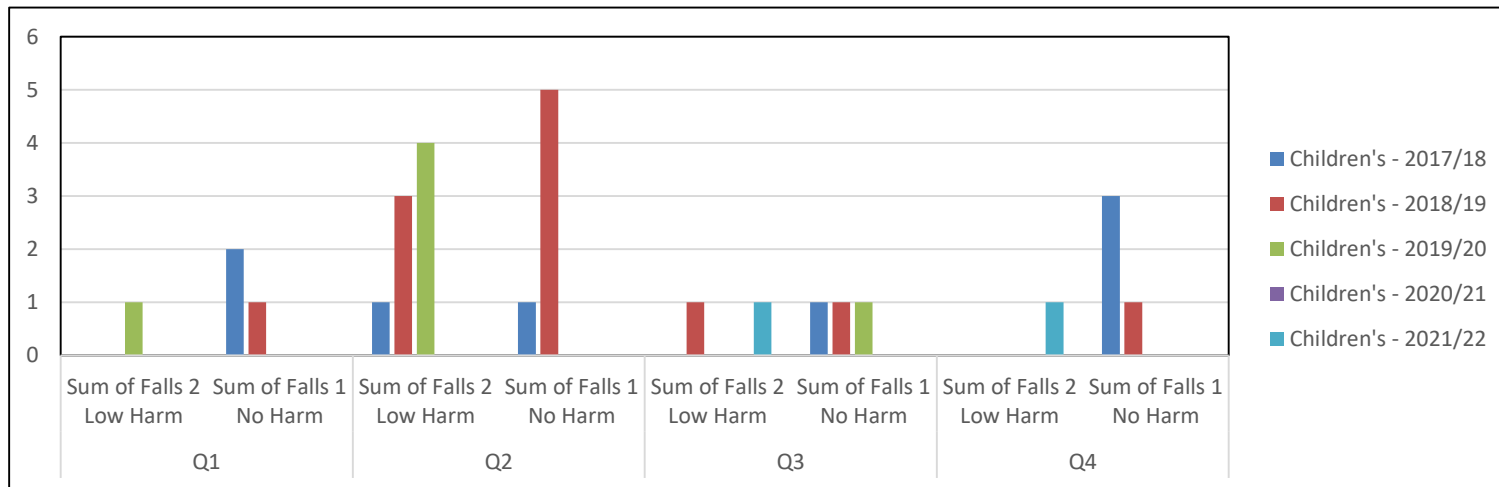

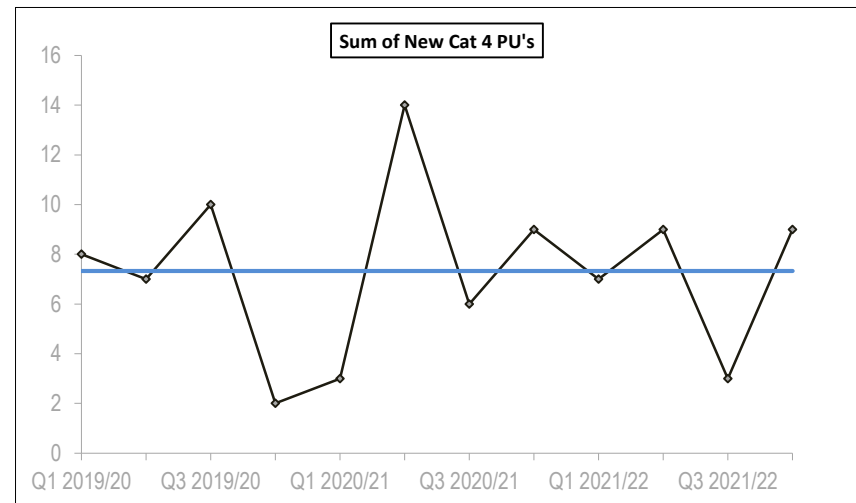
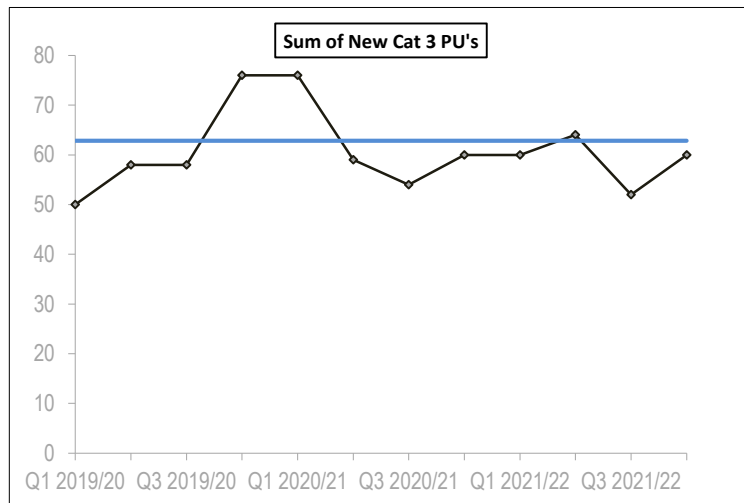
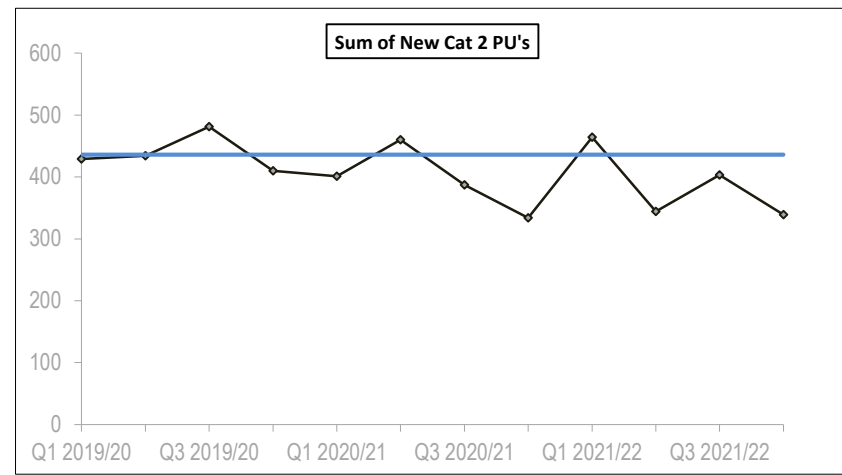
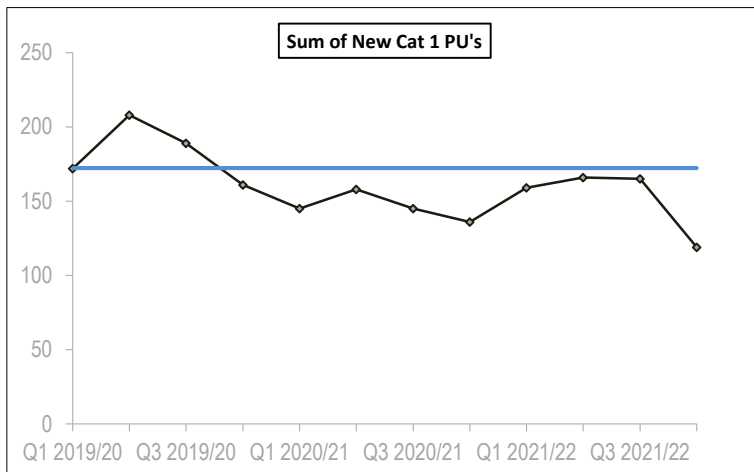


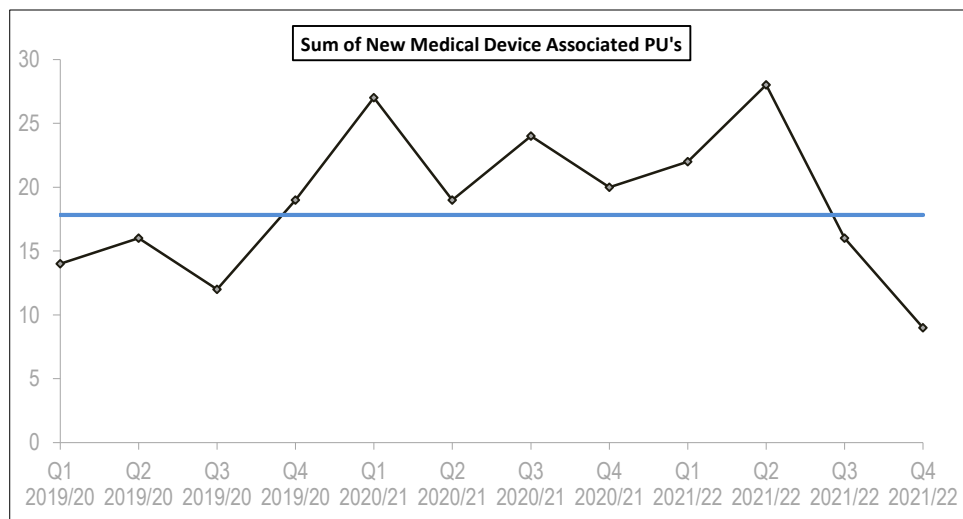
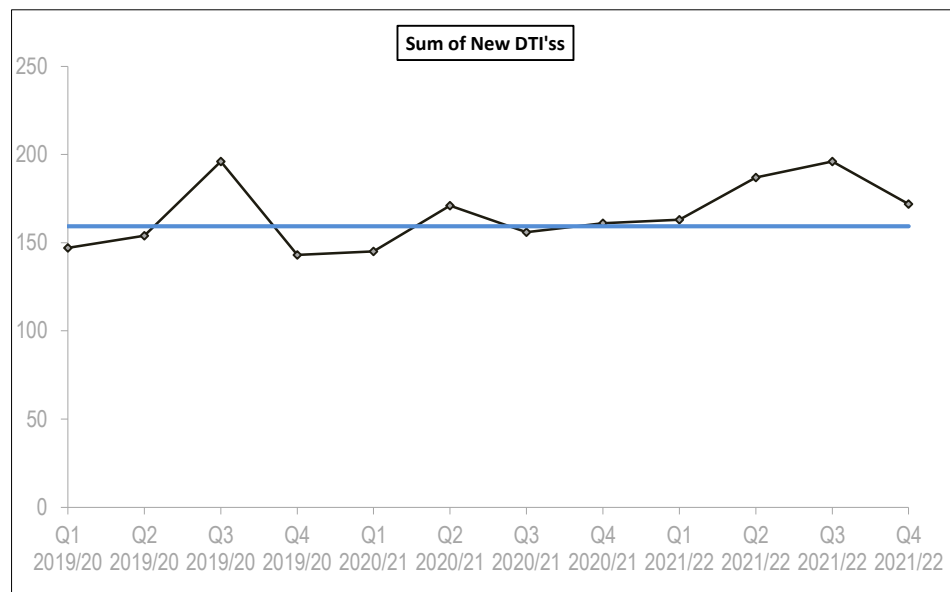
Sum of medication incidents – no harm – incident not prevented (adults)

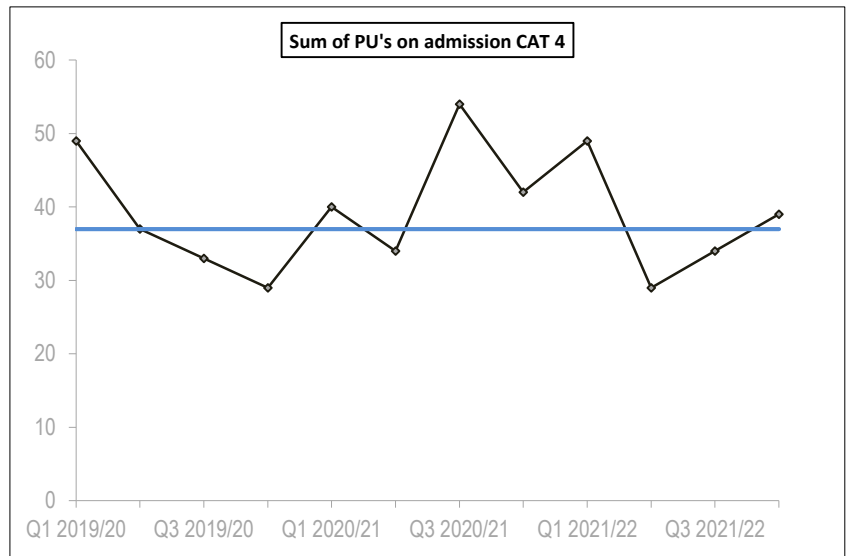
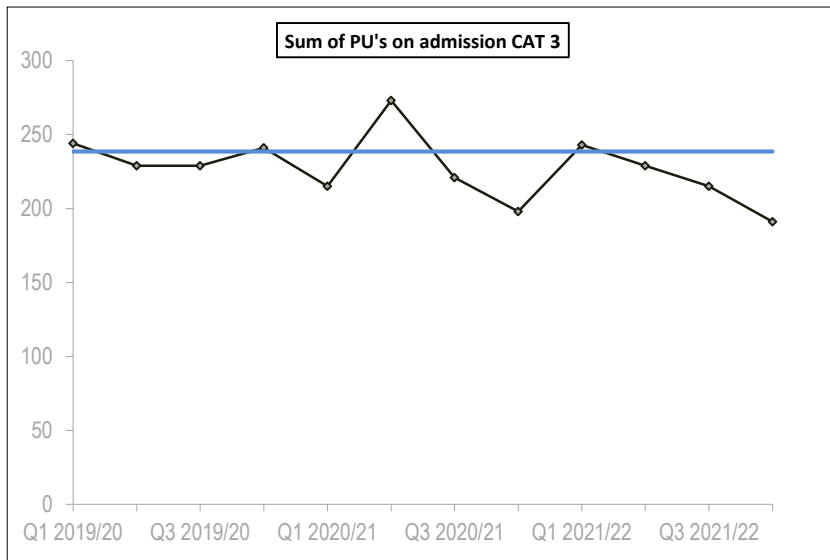
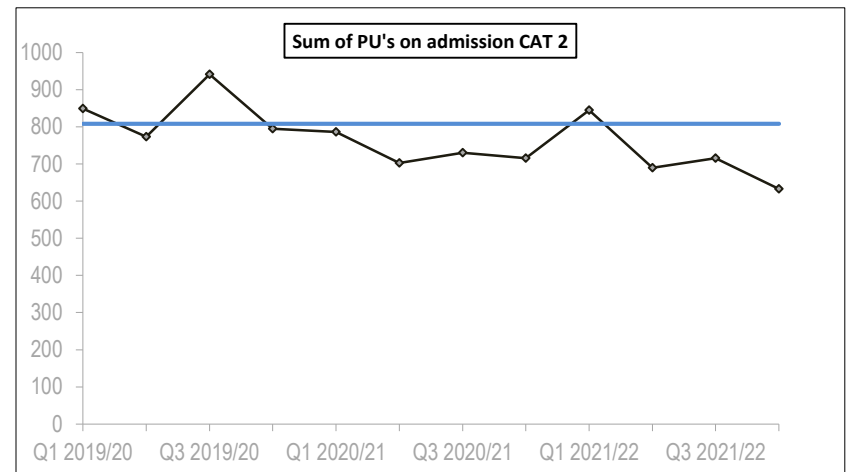
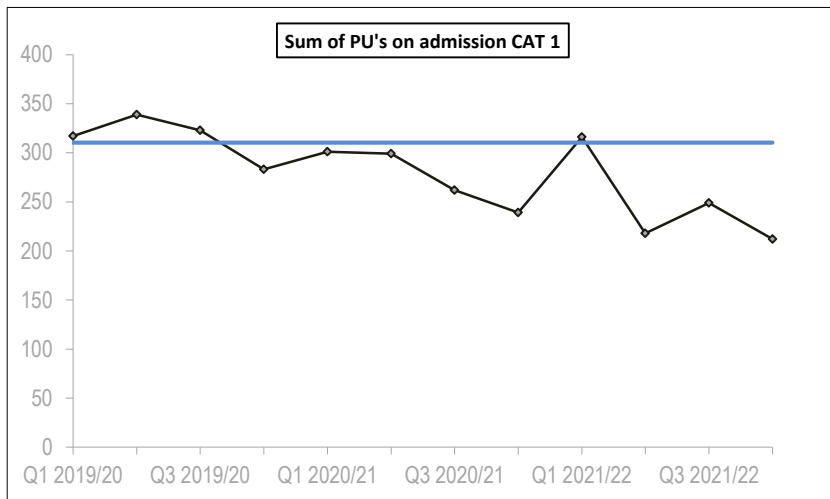


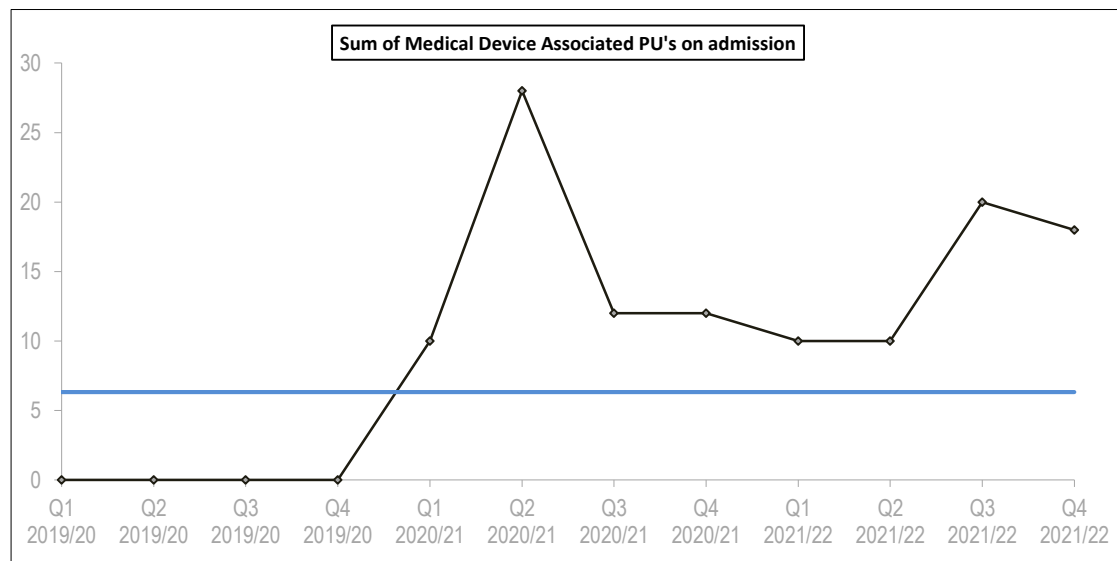
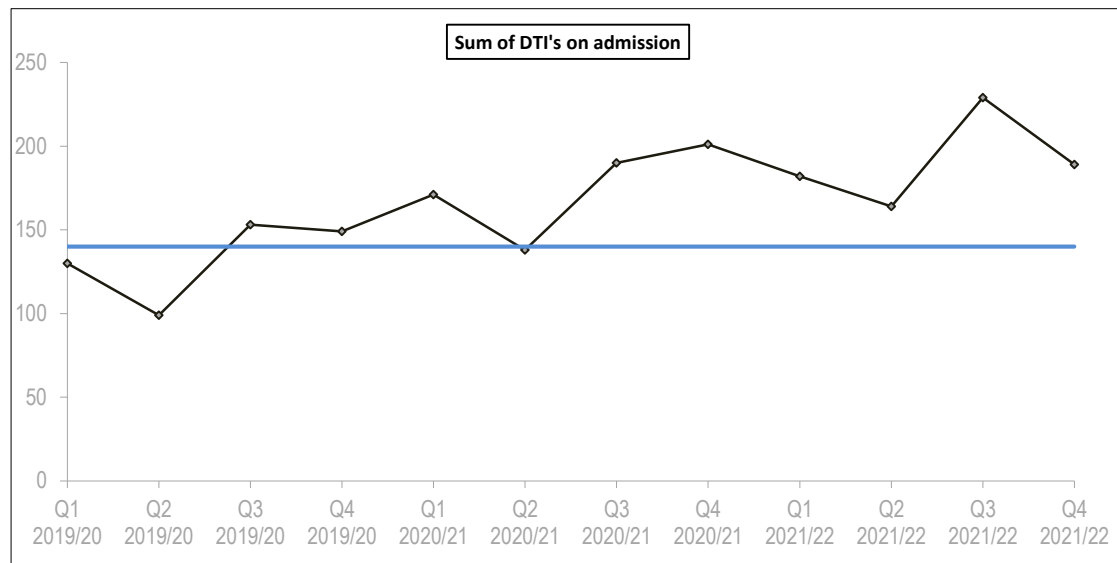
